## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



## **DAVID HOFFMAN**

I want to welcome you to Limmud International's first annual review. This builds on previous newsletters, but rather than just including a selection of events, we wanted to give every group the opportunity to be included, so that we can present a picture of what is going on with Limmud groups all round the world. As you will see, it is a picture of vibrant growth and a wide spread of events.

#### LIMMUD AROUND THE WORLD

Limmud International supports all the Limmud groups outside the UK in producing a whole range of events and community learning activities. I am delighted that this year has seen so many successful Limmud events across the globe – well over 40 outside the UK. These included first time events in Belarus, Peru, India and Ottawa, Limmud LA's first Fest, and a whole range of events on six continents (a full list of this year's events can be found elsewhere in this Review). Plus we have new groups in Haifa, Italy, Miami, Tel Aviv and Vancouver looking to hold events next year. We are most certainly building toward the goal of a Limmud wherever there are Jews.

#### **LIMMUD INTERNATIONAL IN 2013**

Limmud International has been able to support Limmud groups this year in a number of ways:

 Two very successful regional Training on Tour volunteer and leadership development seminars, in Israel, involving six of the Israeli groups, and in Chicago, involving 14 groups across North America.

- More communication with groups and about our activities, including monthly e-bulletins, the Limmud International blog to report on events, and this first Limmud International Annual Review, based on a Limmud-wide survey of groups.
- Launching the Limmud International Resource
   Directory to encourage the sharing of documents
   with and between groups online, to supplement the
   Limmud International Online Forum for discussions
   of topical issues.
- Providing Limmud groups with chavruta books from the Limmud chavruta project.

If you are a volunteer with a Limmud group, do make sure that your group has access to these resources – especially the online Resource Directory and Forum that you receive our emails (and that we receive yours!), and please do keep us posted with the dates of your events in advance and share reports of your events afterwards for the Limmud International blog.

In addition, I am keen to ensure that every group benefits from a support and development visit from Limmud International when it needs it – whether to help get you started, to support volunteer development, to attend an event or to provide training. These visits to Limmud groups around the world are one of our most important activities, to provide you with mentoring support and development and to help generate and sustain volunteer enthusiasm. Our aim is to visit every group within the next 3 years, and we will be using the information from the recent survey to help plan this programme to make the timing, content and experience as useful as possible.

Of course, all of this is very much a team effort, relying on the hard work of a whole host of volunteers and professionals. The work of Limmud International this year has built on the work of my predecessors Helena Miller and Uri Berkowitz. The Limmud International Steering Group this year has been a valuable forum for discussion and actively helped drive activities forward: thanks to Toby Axelrod, David Bilchitz, Rebecca Lester, Shlomit Naim-Naor, Shep Rosenman and Shoshana Waskow. ## Limmud SA Cape Town

Limmud Cape Town has had an exceptionally busy 2013. Not only did we participate in a national training seminar in Johannesburg and hold regular volunteer meetings, but we

organised an exciting one-day Taste of Limmud event in May and a weekend-long Limmud Conference in August. We have also represented ourselves at official Cape Jewish community events, such as the Yom Ha'atzmaut event, the Ignite Young Leadership Development initiative and the Board of Deputies Conference on Safe Spaces, thereby increasing our presence in the community.

Our Taste of Limmud event, chaired by Orli Barnett and Lara Fish, featured a host of exciting presenters and a full Young Limmud programme. Delegates were treated to 10 sessions including a hands-on challah baking workshop, a panel discussion on Jewish education and even a journey into finding their Jewish J-spot!

On Friday 2 August, hundreds of Cape Town Jews began the annual exodus to the Protea Technopark hotel in Stellenbosch for our 7th residential Limmud Conference. The weekend-long event was an unprecedented success, with all spaces booked for both the full conference and the Sunday visitor option. Partnerships with youth movements and student organisations meant a much larger youth presence then in previous years, with delegates commenting on the increased energy and "buzz" at the venue. Over 130 sessions were held, over 80 presenters shared their talent and enthusiasm, and even the weather cooperated. A huge thanks must go to all of the incredible Limmud Cape Town volunteers for putting together such an exciting event.

A resoundingly successful Limmud conference was held in Durban on the 5th mmuu and 6th of August.

Flanked by excellently attended and positively received conferences in Cape Town and Johannesburg, Durban held its own and enjoyed glowing reviews throughout and post the event.

For two evenings at the Durban Jewish Club, local delegates and visitors to Durban shared their Jewish experiences, thoughts, observations and insights.

The atmosphere was charged as people bustled from one session to another enjoying the balanced and substantial programme. The dinners were festive and the workings almost seamless, testimony to the dedicated team of volunteers who spared no effort in tailoring the experience for the Durban community.

Both national and international presenters, of which there were 12 and 9 respectively, drew good crowds.

Likely to have been the most well attended of sessions was the JDov-style talk. Giving the "Jewish talk of their lives" in 12 minutes were a well-published political analyst, an Orthodox Rabbi and world-renowned

thinker, and - representing the locals - a brave young humanitarian. These eloquent presenters expressed with candid openness their nuanced love of Judaism and in so doing inspired many present to appreciate their own.

If in life we endeavor to keep growing, then Limmud is like a watering can. The UK-born Jewish learning concept is providing an annual sprinkling of holistic enrichment across the Jewish world, and here in Durban it is now firmly rooted in the Jewish calendar of events.

Limmud SA Johannesburg saw two new volunteers step up to chair the region in 2013. Daniel Barnett, who grew up in Habonim Dror and Hinda Mendelow, a

graduate from Torah Academy and Chabad, hailed from vastly different parts of our community yet came together to take Limmud SA Johannesburg forward to new and greater heights.

Our first event of the year was a Taste of Limmud held at the Maboneng Precinct in the centre of the city. This area was once near the epicentre of Jewish Johannesburg, but Jewish life and activity in the centre of the city has been on the decline for a number of years. The event, which was well-attended and diverse, was a great way to kick off our campaign for the main conference.

We also decided to move our residential conference to Johannesburg, instead of hosting it outside of the city. Due to a national holiday on the Friday, we were able to host our first ever hybrid model, where people could either come for the Friday and/or the Sunday, or the full weekend residential Shabbat experience. We were unsure if delegates would be willing to spend a considerable amount of money for an event which was 25 minutes' drive from their homes. However, the feedback was overwhelmingly positive. Our volunteers pulled off the best Limmud residential event held thus far in Johannesburg. We had over 400 people for the weekend and an additional 500 day visitors. We look forward to continued growth next year. It is gratifying to see almost all of our core volunteers committed to 2014 and so many new volunteers step up to be involved in 2014.

## Limmud Hong Kong

Just hours before the first Limmud Hong Kong the majority of the community was still asking, what is Limmud? Yet, despite this (as well as the fact that only 25 people signed up prior to the event), the inaugural Limmud Hong Kong, sponsored by the Hong Kong Jewish Community Centre, drew participation from approximately 85 members of the community representing an incredible cross section.

For some it was the novelty of the event, for others it was the chance to be part of something bigger and connected to the larger Jewish world and for others it was the content offered. And for a few, though less inclined to admit it, it was the cocktail and dessert party or the more than gentle nudge from one of their organizer friends. Irrespective of the motivations of the participants, it was an incredible start to something big for this community.

The majority of the team of organizers attended and were inspired by the Great Wall Limmud held last year in Beijing and were eager to create an even more local version of this event back home in Hong Kong.

This communal experiment was designed to run the course of one evening with two learning sessions, of three options each, followed by a cocktail party featuring live music. Here we learned about Maimonides and infected mushrooms, Talmud and tofu, but what we really learned, was that there is so much to learn from one another. We needn't look further than our own friends and neighbors to source talent, knowledge, unique perspectives and creativity; our own innovative, diverse and engaging program was right here for us.

Limmud NZ's fourth annual Limmud over the weekend 10-11 August was another huge success! While we are tiny and far-flung by international standards, our presenters and

participants were world class...starting from our opening plenary session on Shabbat afternoon with Ruth Calderon through to the last session with Rafi Zarum on Sunday evening, with fabulous local and international speakers in between.

Limmud NZ has succeeded in bringing together Jews from across the religious spectrum and involving many unaffiliated Jews who rarely if ever come to Jewish events. For the first time we had more local applicants for presenting slots than we could accommodate which was a lovely conundrum for us. We feel Limmud has a secure place on the NZ Jewish community calendar as the biggest Jewish event of the year here. While the smallness of our community is sometimes viewed as a negative, it also acts as a positive force in that Limmud can't afford to only deal with one or two parts of the community – we must appeal to everyone to succeed. As a result both youth groups (Bnei Akiva and Habonim Dror) had an active role in Limmud. Children were welcomed with special programming, all Rabbis in the community attended as well as Jews from all corners of NZ (and a few from Australia).

This year we also pushed the "volunticipation" model hard, and as a result more than half our participants volunteered in some capacity or another. Creating a culture where people both value and pay for Limmud, and contribute actively through volunteering, is a focus for us.

Challenges remain – the core Steering Group (most of who have been involved for years) is trying hard to implement a succession plan to replace ourselves. We have developed a great product and now we need to hand that over to the next group to flourish in new directions. We are looking forward to Limmud NZ 2014....

Chris year was a significant year of growth and development for Limmud

Sydney. Our major 2.5-day event (non-residential), Limmud-Oz, was held over the long weekend in June and was a great success. It was the biggest ever, with over 1,200 people in attendance, and by many accounts, the best ever too. We also made huge strides with our Young Limmud program, which was a target area for this year. It grew spectacularly with quality programming for three age groups. In fact, overall, there was a much higher level of participation of younger people (young adults and children), which is a segment we work very hard to attract.

Limmud-Oz also made headlines in the Jewish press this year due to the inclusion of a presenter who holds very controversial and critical views on Israel (even though his session wasn't actually about Israel). It provoked a great deal of discussion in the community about the idea of red lines and the place of Limmud in the community.

The main change and challenge this year revolved around our transition to a more fully volunteer-led model. Limmud Sydney operates through the support of The Shalom Institute. Limmud is becoming more autonomous and this year was the first year volunteers chaired Limmud-Oz. This was a very positive step but managing the dynamic and working relationships between volunteers and staff needs a lot more attention.

The three day national Conference of Limmud France took place in the beautiful setting of Parc Hotel Coudray Montceau, 35 kms south of Paris. This was the 7th

national Conference and, as the previous ones, it was a great success. 600 participants joined the Conference and its 160 activities, including sessions in English, and a special program for children and youngsters. Participants came from all over France, as well as from more than 10 different countries (Israel, USA, Mexico, UK, Spain, Belgium, Italy, Austria, Hungary, Switzerland, Luxembourg).

The program included all types of activities (Culture, History, Torah, Leadership, Community, Israel, etc.), with two special themes: Spain (with lectures covering the history of Spanish Jews and also art, music, literature, architecture etc.) and the Couple (with sessions that dealt with the romantic encounter, the communication inside the couple, the desire, the divorce, the gay marriage etc). We also organized sports activities (walks in the Parc with the KKL, Krav Maga, running, dance), theater plays, and games. Three different Shabbat services took place (Orthodox, Masorti, and Liberal) and Limmud is probably the only place in France where this is possible.

As usual with Limmud France, the thrill was not only in the activities, but also in the wonderful atmosphere that developed all over the 3 days, and which enabled many encounters, unexpected discussions, and even improvised concerts in the lobby of the hotel. The food was also great, especially for Shabbat dinner with a fully packed dining room singing together Kiddush and various songs.

Half of the participants were coming for the first time and several of them are already enthusiastic and ready to come back! Once again, the organization of this big event went on (almost) smoothly, thanks to the amazing team of 60 volunteers. No burn-out: we are planning the next Conference that will take place from February 28th to March 2nd, 2014. Join us!

## Limmud FSU Belarus

Over 500 Jews from across Belarus, most of them aged between 20-40, gathered in the town of Vitebsk, Belarus from

May 31-June 2, 2013 for the first Limmud FSU Belarus. This featured a packed program of lectures, workshops, round-table discussions, music and a wide selection of cultural events held simultaneously in six different halls, many of them inspired by the fact that the conference took place in Vitebsk, the hometown of Marc Chagall, the celebrated Jewish artist.

Among the presenters at the conference were leading academics, politicians, writers and artists from the USA, Israel, Russia, Belarus and Ukraine. Prior to the Limmud FSU festival in Vitebsk, a series of ceremonial events took place in Vishneyeva, Belarus, the town where Israel's President Shimon Peres was born, to celebrate his ninetieth birthday. As part of the events in Vishnyeva, a special photographic exhibition was opened dedicated to the life and work of President Peres and a plaque was unveiled on the building which now occupies the site where President Peres grew up. Earlier in the day,

Limmud FSU representatives and participants, together with citizens of the town, held an emotional memorial service at the "Valley of Death" monument which commemorates the 2,000 Jews of Vishnyeva murdered at the hands of the Nazis.

Following the Limmud FSU festival, participants took part in festivities which launched a series of events around the world marking the 100th birthday of former Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin. The commemorative event, organized by Limmud FSU, the Jewish community of Brisk (Brest) and the Menachem Begin Heritage Center in Jerusalem, took place in front of the school in Brisk that Begin attended as a child and marked the official launching of a series of events to honour the former prime minister and Nobel Peace Prize laureate.



A record number of 1,100 participants, mainly from Moscow, but also from other cities in Russia and the former Soviet

Union, gathered in April this year for the largest Limmud FSU Moscow in the six years since its inception. Limmud FSU conferences are considered to be one of the most prestigious of Jewish cultural events in the FSU, providing a festival of Jewish learning with a packed program of lectures and a wide-range of cultural

events presented in three different languages - Russian. English and Hebrew. The



event in Moscow is the flagship of the Limmud FSU project for young Russian-speaking adults. Among the presenters were leading academics, politicians, writers and artists from the U.S., Israel, Russia and elsewhere, including Israeli TV presenter Gil Hovav, theatre producer Mark Rozovsky, Limmud co-founder Clive Lawton, the distinguished Russian journalist Nikolai Svanidze, businessman Eugene Kogan, social activist Lev Rubinstein, economist Mark Urnov, blogger Anton Nossik and many others.

On October 25 Limmud FSU came to St. Petersburg for the third time. Some 400 people attended the conference during three

wonderful days packed with educational opportunities and entertainment of all sorts; all in the usual Limmud spirit of pluralism and volunteering, together with like-minded people

who had come to celebrate the phenomenon of Limmud in Russia and C.I.S. Staying as we were, not far from the summer residence of Russian monarchs that is often referred to as the "Russian Versailles," emphasized the disconnect of Jewish history. inasmuch as Jews could



never have stayed here just a hundred years earlier. Amazing that a Jewish conference could be held in the historical shadow of Russian royal history!

Limmud in St. Petersburg cherishes its really intimate nature and its local cultural heritage. Topics included entrepreneurship, leadership, the Holocaust, educational philosophy, history, cinema, fashion, Judaism, the Middle East and, of course, Israel. Presenters included Aharon Weiss, a Holocaust survivor and historian, who delivered a lecture on Jewish historical memory in the former Soviet Union, Israeli actress Yelena Yaralova, the poet and philosopher Lev Rubinstein and the historian Ilya Altman from the Conference on Jewish Material Claims against Germany.

Limmud FSU St Petersburg was a great success and promises to go from strength to strength in the future.



A highlight of the event was the participation of Danish chief rabbi emeritus Bent Melchior. In his session, What About Interfaith Marriage, the active octogenarian asked himself difficult questions, and answered equally challenging ones from participants. Among the presenters at the conference were leading academics, politicians, writers and artists hailing from the U.S., Israel, Russia and elsewhere, such as Shmuley Boteach, rabbi, author and television and radio host; Irwin Cotler, Member of Canadian Parliament; and David Brinn, Managing Editor of The Jerusalem Post.

Limud México ha sido una experiencia muy novedosa para la comunidad judía ya que ha posibilitado ver otras formas

de conexión entre nosotros. El 28 de octubre de 2012 realizamos el primer Día Limud con una asistencia de 230 personas en lo que resultó una verdadera fiesta del judaísmo con más de 50 sesiones sobre los temas: historia y pensamiento judío, mi comunidad, Israel, arte y cultura judía y lo judío en la vida cotidiana.

Limud Perú se logró gracias al trabajo conjunto de las tres Kehilot que conforman la Asociación Judía del Perú, con el

estrecho apoyo de Hebraica (afiliada a Maccabi), del Colegio "León Pinelo", (el colegio judío de Perú) y del Hanoar haTzioni y contando con la colaboración del Joint.

Limud Perú Asistieron 450 adultos, 100 jovenes y 60 niños menores. Limud Perú contó con 40 expositores de la comunidad, 10 personas de diferentes edades e instituciones en el equipo de organización y 50 jovenes que apoyaron a lo largo del dia en las inscripciones y la orientación permanente.

El programa para adultos contó con 40 sesiones a lo largo de 5 bloques horarios y con 8 ejes temáticos en cada uno: espiritualidad y misticismo, actualidad de Israel y el mundo judío, sionismo activo, psicología y judaísmo, humor, música y comics, sesiones de debates, talleres dinámicos (coaching) y clases de cocina

Adicionalmente se ofrecieron en paralelo 7 documentales sobre música y humor en un bloque llamado "Miscelanea Mishelanu" y 7 peliculas en "Cine Ma Tov".

Para los jóvenes tuvimos "Limud Sport" y "Limud laNoar" y para los niños "Limud Katan". Durante el almuerzo se presentó un show de Klezmer a cargo de dos músicos israelíes y el evento se cerró con el tenor y jazán argentino Dario Sayegh.

El evento fue gratuito para los asistentes gracias al apoyo de empresas auspiciadoras cuyos propietarios son directivos de la comunidad, lo que demuestra el compromiso del liderazgo comunitario con la educación y el mejoramiento continuo del judaísmo en Perú.

Limmud Peru was achieved through working together with the three communities that form the Jewish Association

of Peru, and with the strong support of Hebraica (which is affiliated to Maccabi), Leon Pinelo High School (the Peruvian Jewish High School), Hanoar Hatzioni and in collaboration with JDC.



Limmud Peru had 450 adults, 100 teenagers and young people and

60 younger children. There were 40 exhibitors from the community, 10 people of different ages and institutions in the steering committee and 50 young people who helped with registration and orientation on the day,

The adult programme contained 40 sessions over 5 time slots, covering 8 different themes: spirituality and mysticism, Israel and the Jewish world today, active Zionism, psychology and Judaism, comedy, music and comics, discussion and debate, coaching workshops and cookery. Two additional tracks were offered in parallel to the main sessions. "Miscelanea Mishelanu" featured seven documentaries about music and humour and "Cine Ma Tov" showed seven films.

There were also two activities for teenagers – "Limmud Sport" and "Limmud laNoar", and "Limmud Katan" for children, and a live Klezmer concert during lunch by two Israeli musicians, with the event finished off by the Argentinian tenor and jazz musician Dario Sayegh.

The event was free with the grateful help and support of business and companies whose owners are community leaders, thereby demonstrating their communal leadership in the education and continuous improvement of Judaism in Peru.

**Expanding Jewish horizons:** we strive to create experiences which will allow all to strengthen their Jewish identity

**Community and mutual responsibility:** we strive to create community – together we can achieve more than as individuals

**Commitment to respect:** we expect our participants to act respectfully to each other, including to all volunteers. We believe it is important to make presenters' biographies clear enough to aid informed choice. We are committed to treating all of our participants, and all sessions presented, with equal respect. No-one is more important than anyone else.

'For the Sake of Heaven': we do not seek to place greater or lesser value on one way of Jewish life, thinking or belief over any other

**Religious observance:** we recognise that in private areas people will behave as they choose, but we believe in the importance of enabling Shabbat and kashrut to be kept in all public areas as far as possible, so that Jews do not have to separate themselves one from another

**Empowerment:** we believe in the importance of supporting individuals to enable them to maximise their contribution to the community

**Participation and voluntarism:** we believe that all have an important contribution to make, and that this is best done through voluntarism. Limmud is not for profit but for the benefit of the community. As far as possible, any excess resources should always be ploughed back into improving Jewish education.

**Valuing diversity:** we value choice, diversity and accessibility in all our learning. We seek to have the greatest possible diversity of Jews participate in our activities.

**Enabling connections to be made:** we strive to create opportunities for connections across communities and individuals, by providing the space for these to happen
